
There are 21 available seats on the RTD bus that leaves the Holiday Hills club house at 12:45 pm the day of the performance and provides transportation to the Paramount's front door.

## **Wurlitzer Concert at CSU**

May 20<sup>th</sup>, 2005, 7:30 pm Lory Center, CSU, Fort Collins Tickets \$10 (at the door)

"An Evening With Kevin Utter and the Mighty Wurlitzer" will be presented on Friday evening, May 20<sup>th</sup>, 7:30 p.m., at the Lory Student Center at Colorado State University in Fort Collins. The program is being sponsored by the Tri-State Chapter of the American Guild of Organists.

Kevin, a graduate of the C.S.U. organ department, and currently organist at Christ United Methodist Church in Fort Collins, will present a diversified program of classical orchestral transcriptions, "golden oldies", and just a bit of swing/big band music with Harry Ferguson on the sax. He will accompany a short silent film, and relate some of the history of the installed 1927 Wurlitzer pipe organ.

Directions to Lory Student Center: <u>From Hwy 287:</u> North on 287 (College Ave. in Fort Collins) to

Laurel St., which is the northern boundary of the CSU campus.

Turn left on Laurel, cross the RR tracks, and turn left onto the campus at Meldrum St. (after the 2nd stoplight). There is a large parking lot - drive to the southwest part (close to the Transfort Bus Stop), the Lory Student Center is the large building SW of the parking lot. The theater is on the south end of the building – there will be signs inside to direct you!

From I-25: Take I-25 north to the Hwy. 14 exit west (north Ft. Collins). Hwy. 14 becomes Mulberry as you go west into the city. Turn left on College (Hwy. 287). Go south two blocks to Laurel, and right on Laurel following above directions.
