No April event for RMCATOS... Doors Open Denver not for Paramount **Paramount not Open**

We have been informed by the Paramount Theatre management that they have changed their mind and the Paramount Theatre will *NOT* be participating in Doors Open Denver this year.

No reason was given, but the Paramount has an event booked both nights of the open house dates so that is most likely the cause of the change.

Due to a number of factors... one being Holiday Hills is not available on April 23rd, there will be no RMCATOS event in April.

It is our hope that next year the Paramount will again participate in Doors Open Denver and our two days of six hours of non-stop Wurlitzer will resume.

"George" heads to South Carolina... "George II" arrives

George, the custom George Wright 319EX digital theatre organ that has given us so much enjoyment over the past few years, is no longer here! George is now residing in Hilton Head South Carolina.

George II, or George The Second, a custom George Wright IV, Quantum digital theatre organ model, is now housed in the Holiday Hills ballroom and is available for use by RMCATOS and its members.

George had 3 manuals, 23 ranks and 12 speakers. George II has 4 manuals, 33 ranks and 16 speakers. George was a standard console w/20 general pistons. George II is a French console w/30 general pistons. George had main and solo digital pipe chambers. George II has main, solo and percussion chambers.

George II is the organ used to make the recording "Let George Do It.... Again" and George II was the Allen Organ "poster child" for several years.

Some of George II's custom features include: A French Horn rank, the Wurlitzer "D" trumpet rank unified and labeled as a Harmonic Tuba (as George Wright had done), a Lyn Larsen wind chime, an Accompaniment Traps to Pedal coupler, a Splash Cymbal and stereo headphones.



Many members have been involved with the work required by the change of instruments. Rich Brooks, Jim Calm, Bob Koelmel, Leroy Moss, Jud Murphy, Vincent Mirandi and Lee Shaw along with Allen organ dealer Mark Horning and Allen technician Mike Barnhill have all participated in the exit of George and the arrival and installation of George II.

The size of the new instrument has required modifications to a new storage location, new casters on the platform and additional speaker wiring. New backdrop drapes are being sewn by Priscilla Arthur. In May, Walt Strony will be voicing the instrument.

Needless to say, additional costs have been incurred and it is hoped that RMCATOS members will participate in helping the club meet those needs.

The George II Inaugural Concert... Dwightful Diversions

Dwight is Vice-president of Product Development at Allen Organs and is an accomplished organist in addition to a first class engineer. Dwight has performed internationally, at ATOS conventions and has a number of recordings to his credit. In July, Dwight will be moving to Hawaii, so this will be the last time he sees (and plays) George II for a while.

While he is in the area, Dwight Beacham, the Allen Organs mastermind, has volunteered to conduct for our club a digital theatre organ workshop.

Saturday afternoon, May 20th, 2 pm at the Holiday Hills Ballroom, Dwight will use George II to demonstrate theatre organ registration guidelines, playing techniques and the use of MIDI.

Even if you are not a "player", attending this session will give you interesting insight into what a theatre organist must consider in preparation and execution of a theatre organ performance.

George II has some needs... Do It For George!

George II, the new 4-manual digital theatre organ at the Holiday Hills ballroom is available for use by RMCATOS and its members. The installation has many associated costs and for the first time in recent history, the club is asking the membership for dona-

tions to help cover the expenses associated with giving the instrument a new home.

Transportation and installation will be about \$2,500. Voicing is roughly another \$2,000 and there are costs associated with upgrading the facilities.

Directions to Joel's Organ Barn in Kiowa

To get to the organ barn, drive to beautiful downtown Kiowa, Colorado. Proceed to the east edge of town and turn south on County Road 45 (across from the high school, by the water tower). The pavement will end after a mile or so and then the road will turn to the east, keep going.

Look for the tall radio antenna. Keep going east until you come to County Road 49. Turn right (south) and proceed to the top of the hill. When you are even with the radio antenna, there is a driveway to the right with a mailbox (28451 or 28453).

Enter this driveway and go past the first house, bear to the right and go up over the hill, come down the back side and you will see the barn on your left.
