## **Doors Open Denver**

Sunday, April 13<sup>th</sup>, 10 am to 4 pm – (5 pm) Denver Paramount Theatre Everyone is welcome, no charge



The annual Doors Open Denver event, where many of Denver's famous buildings are open to the public, is scheduled for Saturday, April 12<sup>th</sup> & Sunday, April 13<sup>th</sup>.

The Paramount will not participate on the 12<sup>th</sup> because of a confirmed theatre booking but the theatre will be available for our 6 hours (or more) of live non-stop Wurlitzer music on Sunday April 13<sup>th</sup>.

Anyone may stop by whenever they wish and stay as long or as short as they wish. Tours of the theatre will be available and we hope to have a "this is how a pipe organ works" demo in the lobby.

Organists rotating half-hour time slots throughout the day will be Jim Calm, Bob Castle, DeLoy Goeglein and Doug Thompson.

Doors Open Denver officially ends at 4 pm, but anyone in the theatre when the doors close may remain for up to one more hour of "afterglow" live Mighty Wurlitzer music.

#### Getting to the Paramount.....

The Denver Paramount is located on Glenarm, next to Marlow's, just Northeast of the 16<sup>th</sup> Street Mall.

There are several parking lots and parking garages in the area. Parking on Sunday in downtown Denver is usually \$5 or \$6 per day.

Public transportation is an easy (and inexpensive) way to get to the Paramount. Drive to a RTD Park-N-Ride location, take a bus to either end of the 16<sup>th</sup> Street Mall (Union Station or Market St. Station at one end or Civic Center Station at the other), then take the free 16<sup>th</sup> St. Mall Shuttle to Glenarm.

Or take the light rail to the 16<sup>th</sup> street mall and walk a few blocks to Glenarm or take the free shuttle.

### A word about the Paramount

There have been a number of comments on the membership renewal forms, both this year and last year, suggesting we do more "big name organist" events at the Paramount.

Here is a quick review of our working environment relative to the Paramount.

The Denver Paramount is owned and operated by Kroenke Sports Enterprises. We have an excellent relationship with the Kroenke folks. However, the booking rights to the theatre have been leased to Live Nation, a subsidiary of Clear Channel.

Because RMCATOS maintains the Paramount's Wurlitzer, we get a special rate from Kroenke if we rent the theatre. However, since this makes us a "no revenue" event for Live Nation, they normally will not confirm an open date for us any closer than 75 days before an event. They do not want to turn away a "revenue" booking because a "non-revenue" event is using the theatre. This makes it very difficult for us to book talent and give them a firm performance date when we can offer them so little advance notice.

Because we have a large following of folks who use RTD Senior Ride, we also have to find a date when Senior Ride will be available. There is no Senior Ride on dates with home professional baseball or football games. Thus, we must wait for those schedules before we can start looking for our dates.

Although we have a low rental rate at the Paramount, we are required to pay for ushers, a fireman, stage crew, professional theatre cleaning, sound, etc. It usually costs us between \$4,000 and \$5,000 just to open the doors for a given performance.

The turn out for our fee events is usually low.

Some shows we break even, some shows we go in the red. That is why we only do one or two events a year at the Paramount. For Pipes & Stripes we cannot charge admission since it involves an Army band. The event is subsidized by Kroenke Sports and Live Nation, but it still costs us about \$300 to produce that show.

For an additional cost of \$3,000 we could book the Paramount anytime we wanted but we would still probably want to consider RTD Senior ride availability...... any questions?
