## **Doors Open Denver**

Sunday, April 18<sup>th</sup>, 10 am to 4 pm – (5 pm) Denver Paramount Theatre Everyone is welcome, no charge



The annual Doors Open Denver event, where many of Denver's famous buildings are open to the public, is scheduled for Saturday, April 17<sup>th</sup> & Sunday, April 18<sup>th</sup>.

The Paramount will not participate on the 17<sup>th</sup> because of a confirmed theatre booking but the theatre will be available for our 6 hours (or more) of live, non-stop, Wurlitzer music on Sunday, April 18<sup>th</sup>.

Anyone may stop by whenever they wish and stay as long or as short as they wish. Tours of the theatre will be available and we plan to have a "this is how a pipe organ works" demo in the lobby.

Organists rotating half-hour time slots throughout the day will be Jim Calm, Bob Castle, DeLoy Goeglein and Doug Thompson.

Doors Open Denver officially ends at 4 pm, but anyone in the theatre when the doors close may remain for up to one hour more of "afterglow" live Mighty Wurlitzer music.

#### Getting to the Paramount.....

The Denver Paramount is located on Glenarm, next to Marlow's, just Northeast of the 16<sup>th</sup> Street Mall.

There are several parking lots and parking garages in the area. Parking on Sunday in downtown Denver is usually \$5 or \$6 per day.

Public transportation is an easy (and inexpensive) way to get to the Paramount. Drive to an RTD Park-N-Ride location, take a bus to either end of the 16<sup>th</sup> Street Mall (Union Station or Market St. Station at one end or Civic Center Station at the other), then take the free 16<sup>th</sup> St. Mall Shuttle to Glenarm.

Or take the light rail to the 16<sup>th</sup> street mall and walk a few blocks to Glenarm or take the free shuttle.

Utilizing his church and theatre organ background, **DeLoy Goeglein** played his theatre organ arrangement of a favorite hymn tune.



A discussion and demonstration regarding the differences between church organs and theatre organs by **Bob Castle** followed. Bob also played some traditional theatre organ favorites.

The second half of the program featured **Ken** and **Barbara Mervine** with several organ & voice numbers including a medley from "*Phantom*".

**Frank Perko** was next with his own theatre organ arrangements (complete with thunder, rain, car horns, wolf whistles, and rotating red lights) of several well known tunes.

The program closed with Ken at the grand piano and Frank at the GW4Q console playing two outstanding arrangements for piano and classic organ; however, Frank "modified" the organ part to take advantage of the some of the unique capabilities available on a theatre organ. The result brought the house down!
