## "Free @ Paramount"

## Sunday, August 7th, 2 pm Denver Paramount Theatre Members Only, No Charge

Once a year the Denver Paramount gives us a "free day" when we have the Paramount Theatre and its Mighty Wurlitzer all to ourselves!

This year, on Sunday, August 7<sup>th</sup>, we will be treated to a program of theatre organ music performed by a number of organists from the club. There will also be a short photo review of the history of the Denver Paramount and some recent RMCATOS activities ..... accompanied by live Wurlitzer sound.

Doors open at noon. Show starts at 2 pm. No refreshments will be served.

The Denver Paramount is located at 1621 Glenarm, just a few steps from the 16<sup>th</sup> Street Mall. Parking downtown at meters on Sunday is free ..... but the meters fill up fast. The parking lot, off Welton, behind the theatre is \$5 (cash or Visa or MasterCard), and other lots and ramps in the area cost the same or a dollar or two higher.

Another option is to take RTD to the 16<sup>th</sup> St. Mall, then ride the free RTD Mall shuttle to Glenarm.

## **Paramount Update**

#### Second Vox Humana rank installation:

Thanks to the work and leadership of **Don Wick**, the installation of the original second Vox Humana pipe rank in the solo chamber is progressing well.

Don has been constructing and restoring the pipe chest, wind regulator and other parts in his home workshop and bringing them to the Paramount for Wurlitzer work days where he is being assisted by **David Charles** and **Ryan Kroll.** 

Wiring, winding and pipe racks are yet to be completed. The new rank won't be ready for Aug. 7<sup>th</sup>.

#### Uniflex relay upgrade status

The upgrade of new hardware and software for our PC-based "relay" (the "brains" that remembers registrations and controls the pipes and swell shades based on console actions) was first used publicly, master console only, for our "Pipes & Pops" event.

The twin consoles of the Paramount's Wurlitzer are presenting some unique challenges for the new relay hardware and software. We are working closely with the vendor to resolve these problems.
