Sunday, October 16th, a crowd of around 550 converged on the Denver Paramount for an afternoon of Ragtime (and other) theatre organ and grand piano musical delights.



Dave Wickerham at the Mighty Wurlitzer and member Dick Kroeckel at the Steinway Concert Grand Piano put both instruments through their paces with duets and individual solos.

Surprises included the opening of the second half with Dave and Dick rising out of the pit playing "76

Trombones" together at both Wurlitzer twin consoles (dressed in full red, white and blue marching band uniforms complete with white hats and red plumes) ...



then part way through, they left the consoles (while

the organ kept playing) to reunite at the piano playing a piano duet along with the phantom organ to finish off the number.



The performance closed with Stars & Stripes Forever, the big US flag flying in amidst a shower of red, white and blue streamers.
