### A huge success.... "Doors Open Denver 2012"

Although this year there were very few Doors Open Denver buildings in the downtown area participating, that didn't seem to have much affect on those interested in visiting the Denver Paramount.



Doors Open Denver 2012 ran Saturday & Sunday, April 14<sup>th</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup>, from 10 am to 4 pm each day. The official Paramount headcount tallied a total of 1,019 visitors whose ages ranged from babes-inarms to those who have been around almost as long as the Paramount!



RMCATOS members provided live, non-stop, Mighty Wurlitzer music that filled the theatre and was a tremendous surprise and delight for those visiting. Our thanks to our talented organist group of Jim Calm, Bob Castle, Bob Flinn, DeLoy Goeglein, Doug Thompson and Kevin Utter for their fine performances.



Theatre tours were led by Lee Shaw. Former Paramount projectionist Jim Wagoner held forth in the projection booth, and in the lobby "How a pipe organ works" demonstrations were given by Wes Ranstrom, a local organ builder.

Hanging across the back wall of the stage were copies, from the Smithsonian Institute, of the original Wurlitzer blue prints for installation of the Publix I.

On TV monitors throughout the lobby and on a side screen in the auditorium, a 22-minute history presentation played continually. It contained photos, facts and figures relative to the Denver Paramount, the Mighty Wurlitzer and RMCATOS events.

### *Now's your chance...* <u>Want to play the Paramount's Wurlitzer</u> <u>with no one listening?</u>

For those timid organists who have always longed to play the Paramount's Mighty Wurlitzer but were afraid to try it for fear that someone might be listening ..... have we got a deal for you!

This June we will be repeating last year's successful program of making the Paramount's Mighty Wurlitzer available to members who want the thrill of playing the instrument without the pressure of having to "perform" for a group.

The re-install of the original  $2^{nd}$  Vox Humana in the solo chamber brings the Wurlitzer rank count to 21.

Several dates are being scheduled when members can sign up for one or two hours of Wurlitzer time when they can "do their own thing"..... alone or members may bring an entire entourage of doting admirers and have the theatre all to themselves!

A tour of the Paramount can also be included if the member and/or their friends are interested.

There are some costs involved, so there will be a charge of \$5 per hour for the organist. There is no charge for the entourage. If no one has reserved time before or after the original scheduled slot, the additional time may be used.

Call Lee Shaw (**303-530-2421**) and reserve your time. You will even be able to set your own pistons, etc. just like the professionals!

Chose a date: June 9, 11, 16, 17, 19, 23, 24. Select a time from 10 am until 7 pm.

Other dates may be available. Management reserves the right to help you decide what dates and times you might schedule your usage.
