### **Sunday Surprise**

Sunday, August 12<sup>th</sup>, 2 pm Denver Paramount Theatre Glenarm at the 16<sup>th</sup> St. Mall RMCATOS and AGO members only No charge

For our "free day" at the Paramount, we are delighted to have as our guests members of the Denver chapter of the American Guild of Organists (AGO) .... some of whom will be performing.

There will be six artists playing the Paramount's Mighty Wurlitzer: Bryan Dunnewald, **Ingrid Gardner**, **DeLoy Goeglein**, **Ken Mervine**, Frank Perko, and Joel Trekell. All are or have been AGO members and all are church organists.



The program will include classical, religious and theatre organ styles of music and will take advantage of the versatility of the Paramount's 1930, 21-rank, original Publix I Wurlitzer.

Since this is a "members only" private event, there will not be any RTD Senior Ride bus service available for transportation.

Regular RTD bus service, however, may be utilized, taking the bus or light rail to the Denver 16<sup>th</sup> Street Mall, and then walking or taking the free RTD Mall shuttle to Glenarm and the Paramount.

As mentioned, this is a "members only" event. However, if you have friends or family that would like to attend the program, they can do so by becoming RMCATOS members.

August begins our Summer Special for new club memberships: \$10 per household for the rest of the year. So, if the new members are a couple, attending the August 12<sup>th</sup> event will only cost them \$5 each: the normal guest rate for RMCATOS.

Why is admission limited to members only? That is a part of our agreement with the Paramount for them allowing us the free day.

# RMCATOS gets recognition .... The ATOS national convention

Members **Doris Beverly** and **Fern Roberts** attended the national ATOS convention that was held in the Los Angeles area during the week of July 4<sup>th</sup>.

During the course of the event, Doris and Fern heard many fine theatre organs & theatre organ artists and were able to visit a multitude of outstanding organ venues.

At the convention, it was announced that RMCATOS had been awarded a \$1,000 grant for restoration work to be done on the Denver Para-

mount's Wurlitzer. Thanks to **Ryan Kroll** who wrote and submitted the grant application.



At the closing banquet, the announcement was made that **Lee Shaw** was the "Honorary Member of the Year". Lee now becomes a lifetime honorary member of the national ATOS. Doris

Beverly accepted the award from Jack Moelman, ATOS board member, for Lee who could not attend due to Niwot Band commitments.

Looking back over the last few years, RMCATOS members have had an impact on the national ATOS organization. In addition to Lee's award, **Don Wick** has been awarded "Technician of the year" and **Doug Thompson** has been awarded "Amateur Theatre Organist of the year".

The club has also been recipient of several grants for theatre organ preservation.

A crowd of one shy of 125 was present at the Holiday Hills Ballroom for our July 8<sup>th</sup> July JAMboree featuring a few members of the Niwot Community Semi-Marching Free Grange Band.

Paul Schafer opened the event with a piccolo trumpet fanfare from the back of the room with theatre organ accompaniment.

Dr. Jenn Hronkin followed with three clarinet selections also with theatre organ accompaniment. Jenn is a family doctor, a member of the Boulder County Bombers roller derby team, and mother of fiddle player Maggie who appeared next.

Earlier this year, at the National Western Stock Show, 8 year old Maggie won the Colorado Fiddle Championship for her age group.

With poise, talent and intonation skill belying her age, Maggie performed, with theatre organ accompaniment, multiple songs in both halves of the program; always followed by wild applause from the audience.



**Jim Calm** provided the theatre organ accompaniment for all of the performers. Jim, who is an honorary member of the band, also played a few selections on the Theremin with Bob Castle providing support with theatre organ accompaniment.

Brendan Murphy played a few euphonium solos and then was joined for a couple of duets by Paul

Schafer on the flugelhorn.



The afternoon closed with several "band" selections. Brendon and Paul were joined by Jenn on the clarinet, Biff Warren on the trombone & Lee Shaw on the snare drum. Jim Calm and Bob Castle were also added showing their flexibility by switching (after two songs) between theatre organ and piano.

The crowd demanded an encore.
