*About the organists....* **Jim Calm** is a retired music teacher and church organist/choir director. He was born in Chicago, moved to Colorado in the 1960's and graduated from Arvada HS. Jim earned his Bachelor of Music Education degree from CU Boulder and Master of Education degree from Lesley University. He played tuba with the Queen City Jazz Band, Ragtime piano at Shakey's and was an organist at the Organ Grinder pizza restaurant. He now keeps busy playing piano at retirement homes and other gigs, Dixieland tuba with the Mile High Banjo Society and theatre organ at a variety of venues, including the Holiday Hills Ballroom and Paramount theatre in the Denver area, and the Thursday "Sacklunch Serenades" at the City Auditorium in Colorado Springs. Jim and his wife, Rita, live in Lakewood, and have two children and two grandchildren.

**Bob Castle** is a retired member of the Denver District Attorney's office. He was born in Denver and graduated from East HS. Bob has been House Organist for the Denver Paramount theatre since 1947, and has performed at many area theatres and other venues as a soloist and silent film accompanist, including the Paramount, the Holiday Hills Ballroom and the Colorado School of Mines in the Denver area, and the Mount St. Francis Auditorium and City Auditorium in Colorado Springs. Bob is featured, along with American Theatre Organ Society president Ken Double, on a recently released CD recorded at the Paramount titled "Paramount Double Bill."

**Charles Shaeffer** was born in Denver, raised in Kittredge, and graduated from Evergreen HS. He earned Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Music Education from the University of Northern Colorado and was a music teacher for three years before completing a piano tuner apprenticeship. He has been a piano tuner for 39 years and lives in Lakewood with his wife, Thelma. Charles has been Organist at the Denver Consistory for 15 years.

*About the organ....* The **1925 Kimball Symphonic Pipe Organ**, No. 6781, has three manuals and 19 ranks of pipes, hidden in two chambers above the auditorium's domed ceiling. This organ is unique in that it is neither a theatre or a church organ, and is one of a very few of its kind still in existence. An interesting feature of this instrument is the set of four "Bugle Buttons" visible above the solo manual. A two-year total restoration of the console and its 1496 pipes has recently been completed thanks to generous support from the Colorado Historical Society and skilled workmanship by the Ivan P. Morel and Associates, Inc. Pipe Organ Builders.

*About the organ club....* The **RMCATOS** (Rocky Mtn Chapter American Theatre Organ Society) is dedicated to the preservation and promotion of theatre pipe organs and theatre organ music. Membership is \$15 per year, per household. The club has monthly "socials" and sponsors periodic public events. The socials are generally held at the Holiday Hills ballroom in Federal Heights where there is access to a 4-manual, 33 rank GW4Q digital theatre organ and a 7-foot grand piano. Public events are held mostly at the Denver Paramount theatre where the club maintains the theatre's original twin-console 4-manual, 20 rank 1930 Mighty Wurlitzer. The next RMCATOS public event is "Pipes & Pops" at the Paramount on Sunday, April 10<sup>th</sup> at 2 pm. Featured is Brett Valliant "The Wichita Wurlitzer Wizard" along with the Denver School of the Arts band ensembles. An afternoon of music for the whole family. Adult tickets are \$12 at the door (\$13 at [www.TicketHorse.com](http://www.TicketHorse.com)) and include free parking. Students 18 and under do not need tickets.
